Experience the Best Facilities at the Hub



The Nunawading Community Hub is a contemporary building that will provide the Whitehorse community with state-of-the-art facilities combined with comfort, practicality, and flexibility of indoor and outdoor spaces.

A “Green” Facility

The hub is a leading “green” facility with a 5-star Green Star rating. Some of its ecologically-sustainable design features include solar renewable energy for lighting and hot water heating, rainwater harvesting for toilet flushing, double insulation in the roof cavity, double-glazing, LED lighting, use of natural and durable materials such as timbers and concrete with recycled content.

A Fully Accessible Site

The hub site is designed to ensure that people of all ages and abilities can access the various indoor and outdoor spaces.

The building has wide corridors, a lift, internal ramp connecting the ground and upper ground levels and mobility scooter parking near the lift.

The public car park off Esdale Street has more than 200 parking bays including accessible parking, is well lit and allows easy access to the main building, heritage building and outdoor recreation area.

Shared pathways on both sides of the outdoor recreation area provide seamless connectivity between the hub site and adjacent Tunstall Park.

Spaces for Learning and Getting Active

The hub has 13 different-sized, multipurpose spaces designed to accommodate a diverse range of activities and interests.

These spaces include:



- two large, inter-connected studios with wooden sprung floors for dance activities, functions, conferences and other events
- seven multipurpose studios for art and other hands-on learning
- five rooms for meetings and classrooms for passive learning activities
- a full-size stadium with wooden sprung floor able to host competition basketball, badminton (three courts) and other recreational activities.

Spaces at the hub are available to book, subject to availability.

All studios and meeting rooms have a large television screen, AV technology and Wifi.

All spaces will have climate-controlled heating/cooling.

Bringing the Outside In

The clever design of the hub draws in the beautiful surrounds of Tunstall Park. Ceiling-to-floor double glazing along the curved west side of the building allows the multipurpose studios and shared dining space to take full advantage of the beautiful natural surrounds, creating inspiring settings for creativity, learning and socialising.
