Nunawading Community Hub Development The new vibrant heart of Nunawading Project Update — August 2020



Construction Is Complete!

Council's vision to transform the former Nunawading Primary School site into a magnificent new community facility for the continued benefit of the Whitehorse community has been realised with completion of the new Nunawading Community Hub.

The hub will be a place where everyone will feel welcome and can come together to embrace new opportunities to make new friends, learn new skills and participate in new activities.

Council's Meals on Wheels service and community groups occupying dedicated spaces in the hub will relocate from Silver Grove in September, subject to COVID-19 restrictions

Official Opening Online

Due to current COVID-19 restrictions, an official opening onsite is not possible, so Whitehorse Mayor Cr Sharon Ellis will declare the hub open via Council's Facebook page on Saturday 5 September at 10.00am. The announcement will be available www.facebook.com/whitehorsecitycouncil/.

As COVID-19 restrictions allow, an onsite event will be organised in the future so everyone can come together and celebrate this wonderful facility.

Hub Operations

Although the hub will be officially open, public use of the facility will be in line with COVID-19 restrictions. This means that the hub may not be able to operate at all for a period of time or there will be restrictions on the number of people who can be inside and outside the facility at any one time. There may also be limited or no access to certain areas of the hub such as shared tea/coffee stations, communal kitchen/dining space or occasional furniture.

When open during COVID-19 restrictions, access to the hub will be limited to those with a booking or attending a class.

When open, the hub's operating hours will be:

- Monday - Thursday: 8.30am-10.00pm
- Friday: 8.30am-10.30pm
- Saturday: 9.00am-10.30pm
- Sunday: 9.00am-8pm



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Council staff will be available during operating hours to monitor attendance, answer questions and assist patrons to find their way around the facility.

This group runs fitness, dance and exercise classes. People of all ages are welcome.

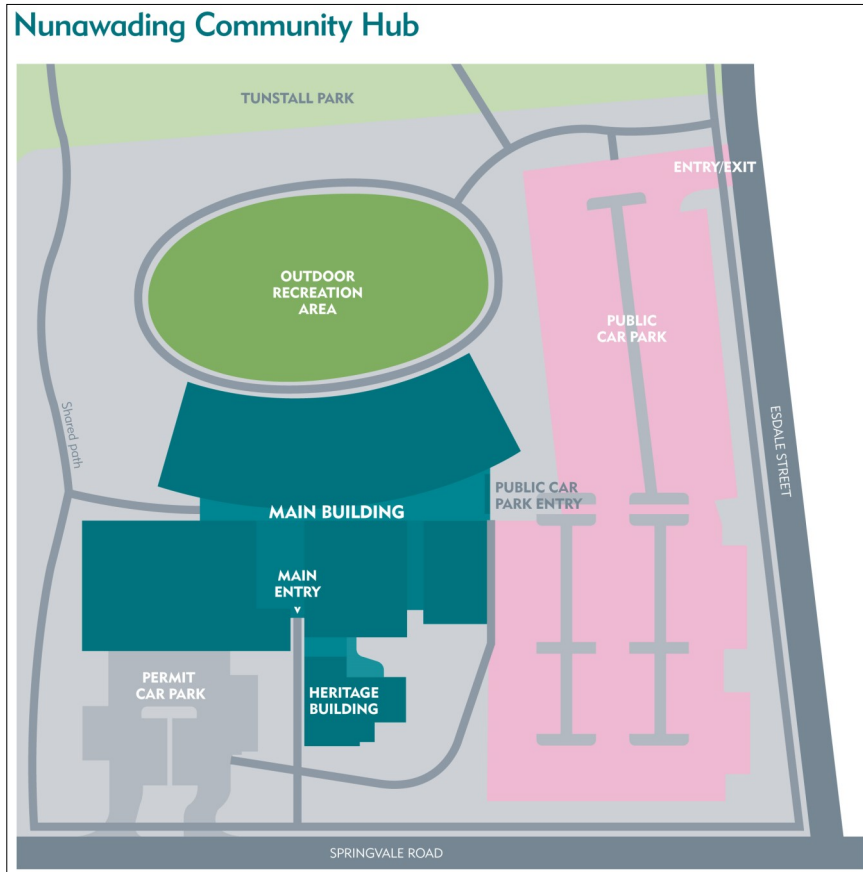
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Getting to the Hub

The hub is located at 96-106 Springvale Road, Nunawading.



Getting to the hub is easy:

- Car :** More than 200 parking spaces are available. There is a four-hour parking limit.
- Bus :** The bus stop is located outside the facility on Springvale Road.
- Train :** The hub is located approximately 1km from the Nunawading Train Station.
- Walk :** The main pedestrian entry is 96-106 Springvale Road, Nunawading.
- Bike :** Undercover bike racks are located at the main entry.
